### **Notes:-**

Oxwich Village is located on the western side of Oxwich Bay and is approximately 16 miles west of Swansea on the south coast of the Gower Peninsula and Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The Conservation Area comprises of the main body of the village extending southwards as far as the Church of St. Illtyd.

The village is of a linear form and extends from the foreshore in the south along the main street in a northerly direction, having the fine Oxwich Woods on steeply sloping ground to the west leading to Oxwich Castle.

The village comprises mainly of small scale traditional cottages and houses, which has a mainly linear form with the houses and cottages laid out informally along both sides of the main street.
