### **Notes:-**

Section of late Georgian domestic terrace slightly splayed from centre and with exposed gable to Quay Parade (A483).

Three-storey and basement rendered and painted brick fronts (exposed at No. 7), three plain pilasters. Continuous slate roof, chimneys to centre only, pitched dormer and boxed eaves to No. 7.

Three windows to No's. 2 to 5, two windows to No's. 6 to 7, arched recesses to first floor centre (wide segmental arch to No. 6), continues down as two storey recess with brick voussiors to No. 7. Small-paned sash windows (some with blind recesses), mostly renewed, modern first floor window to No. 6 with bracket over. Six-panel Georgian doors up steps, No. 6 with overall fascia to pilastered shop front, gabled reveals to nine panel door on left, shop door to right. Three storey two window door on left, shop door to right. Three storey two window rendered elevation to Ferryside. Gabled extensions to rear of No's. 2 and 3, extension to rear of No. 4 runs back to Bath Lane.
