Notes:-

In a terrace group stepping down from Pembroke Buildings on left.

After 1810. Designed by William Jernegan, architect of Swansea.

Wide two-storey and basement five bay façade, cement render upper floor, exposed rusticated blocks to ground floor facings behind Tuscan colonnade (formerly a loggia). Hipped slate roof, wide eaves, panelled pilasters and channelled rustication to outer first floor window bays, incised panels over centre bays. Plain margins to small-frame sash windows, incised aprons. Panelled end pilasters to ground floor, boarded small-pane windows, channelled voussoirs, segmental arch to centre doorway up steps. Area railings removed.
