### **Notes:-**

#### ***Location:-***

On edge of woodland about 500 metres north of M4; reached via a lane on west side of minor road from Llangyfelach to Felindre.

#### ***History:-***

H-plan house: core probably dates from 1630's, south crosswing built 1741 by Robert Morris (died 1768), north crosswing built 1790 by John Morris (1745-1819) both of the important family of industrialists. The family are believed to have lived here before the building of their mansion at Clasemount. House extensively and carefully restored from near dereliction during the 1980s and 1990s.

#### ***Exterior:-***

H-plan house with central north-south core and crosswing to each end. Grey-brown rubble with some render, slate roofs, stone chimneys. Rendered and colour-washed south front of two storeys and attic, three windows; end chimneys; upper windows horned sashes with marginal glazing bars removed from ground floor windows; central doorway under modern open porch with hood supported on iron columns. Left gable has two small sash windows at attic level; right gable (rebuilt?) has two small windows at first floor doorway; ground floor small-pane sash windows: right gable has stone steps up to first floor doorway; ground floor doorway with brick head in rear angle with core block. Core block has square stone chimney, and facing west, on each floor, broad five-light window with wooden mullions; in angle with south block, stone lean-to porch with slate roof.

#### ***Interior:-***

Restored from near dereliction. Retains roof trusses and some purlins, but other roof timbers largely restored. Much restoration of other timber work. South-east corner of core block has wooden stair with re-used 17<sup>th</sup> century balusters; large fireplace to north; blocked window in east wall. Cellar with heavy chamfered beams.

#### ***Listed:-***

An ambitious farmhouse with 17<sup>th</sup> century origins, with additions of both mid and late 18<sup>th</sup> century, carefully restored, with added historic interest of connections with important family of industrialites.
